Located on one of the most beautiful spots of the Cote d'Azur, the gulf of Saint Tropez and its peninsula.



St. Tropez is the place where everyone dreams of visiting at least once in their lifetime. It is an oasis of light for painters and a major attraction for writers, artists and celebrities. St. Tropez was a sleepy little fishing village, which was put on the map by Brigitte Bardot the 'blonde bombshell' film star of the 1950s. Following her rise to fame, the press arrived and it became the 'in place' to visit. At night there is nothing better than to walk along the harbour where the larger boats are moored, and people watch. Here you will often see famous personalities coming off the boats, or in the nearby restaurants. Artists spend their days and evenings by the waterfront exhibiting their paintings - it is a truly magical way to spend an evening.

Ramatuelle, which is virtually next door to St. Tropez, is a typical small Provencal village with its maze of streets and is particularly noted for its 5 km. stretch of sandy beach by the Mediterranean sea known as the famous 'Pampelonne Plage'. Here you can sunbathe and watch the boats sailing past or mooring in the bay for the day. At lunchtime you can stroll along the waters edge and find somewhere to eat in the various restaurants or snack bars situated at the back of the beach, and who knows, you could find yourself sitting next to a famous celebrity!

Directions to holiday park Kontiki

This is described from Calais

Take the A26 auto route out of Calais to Reims
Then take the A4 from Reims to Charlons en Champagne
The road then becomes the A26 again down to Troyes
At Troyes take the A5 to Chaumont and then the road eventually becomes the
A31

At Beaune the road then becomes the A6 Follow the A6 down to Lyon

Follow signs for Lyon centre which takes you through the tunnels. Then follow the signs for:

A7 Marseille Then follow the A8 for Aix en Provence Nice St. Tropez.

Leave the motorway at the exit Le Muy and take the road for St.Maxime, then St.Tropez.

Follow the road passing Port Grimaud on your left, then over the river until you come to a set of traffic lights at a very large roundabout.

Keep in the outside lane and go round the roundabout and then get into the second lane from the left side. (There are several lanes which go into different areas).

At the next set of traffic lights on the roundabout go straight over passing Luna Amusement Park on your right side and the Casino Supermarket on the left.

At the next junction turn right and follow the signs for St. Tropez. You will eventually find yourself on the road by the bay of St. Tropez. Follow that road until you come to a mini-roundabout and turn right towards Ramatuelle and the holiday park.

Follow the road to Ramatuelle for about 5 km. As you come up the hill there are some signs for a riding school, and Kontiki (see photo) is on the left on the brow of the hill.



ARRIVAL AT CAMPSITE:

Park at reception and go inside to register. Tell them you are renting a mobile home. The mobile home is called JOHANN location number $5\ D\ 07$. They will check you in and give you a sticker for your car to be placed on the right hand side of the windscreen.

When you come out of Reception go through the barrier on your right hand side where all the cars are parked, (directly near the Pep spirit). Your car sticker will automatically activate the barrier. Then go through the next barrier into the campsite. Take the 2nd road on the right, and then turn left into the 1st lane and Mobile Home JOHANN is the 2nd one on the right hand side with its own parking space. You might find it easier to approach the mobile home from the other side of the lane once you have settled in and found your bearings.

We would hope your predecessors have left the mobile home completely clean for you, and we would respectively request that you also leave it clean and tidy when you vacate it.

Please note smoking is not allowed in the mobilehome.

You can park your car here next to the mobilehome.



The key to the mobile home is in a master lock box on the right side pillar near the kitchen on the verandah.

Slide down the black cover, then enter the coderemove the key, alter the code to anything to lock it again, then slide the cover back up.

At the end of your holiday, open the lock box using the correct code, replace the key, alter the code to anything again and slide the cover back up to leave it secure for the next person.



<u>Inventory</u>

The mobile home can accommodate 4 a 5 people and also has an extensive inventory including ample cutlery, casserole dishes, baking trays, frying pan, electric wok, saucepans, coffee maker etc. etc. The shower runs off of electricity so you will not run out of gas in the middle of showering!

There is one double bedroom with ample fitted wardrobes, dressing table and cupboards, another bedroom with 2 single beds and wardrobe, and a couch in the lounge that can be converted into a double bed. There are duvets and pillows for the 2 single beds, and a duvet and pillows for the double bedroom. You will need to bring your own bedlinen and towels, or rent at the reception.

There is a shower room with ample cupboards and drawers and a separate toilet with a small washbasin.

There is a fitted kitchen inside the mobile home with a gas oven and 4 burner hob. There is also a fridge freezer.

There is an iron, ironing board, vacuum cleaner, mops and bucket.

There is a TV and radio. You can get Sky news, and you can get English speaking Riviera radio on 106.5. You can also get Riviera radio on your mobile phones, ipods etc.

If you break any glasses or tableware we should be grateful if you would replace the broken item(s).

On the verandah there is a 4 burner gas hob, another fridge freezer and an electric oven on top of it.

There is another sink and a dishwasher.



Outside there is a shed which houses the washing machine. The key to the shed can be found just inside the mobile home door on the right in a stainless steel box on the wall. Please make sure you lock the shed after you have used the washing machine or if you leave the mobile home unattended, and replace the key in the box.

To use the washing machine you need to turn the water on. The lever is on the right hand side just above the machine. Turn the lever to the right hand side. Put your washing in with your tablet, or if using liquid put in the dispenser drawer. Dial up the required washing cycle. Then press the large button on the left hand side and then the 'depart' button.

Also on the verandah is a table and 4 chairs, one double settee and 2 armchairs.

On the patio you have a large gas barbecue, 2 sun loungers, table and 4 chairs with a parasol, and also 2 airers with pegs for washing.

Empty gas cylinder

Both 4 burner hobs and the inside oven use gas.

There is a full backup cylinder of gas at the back of the mobile home. If the gas runs out during your stay please obtain a replacement (red or grey butane) by ringing Eric (00-33607474575), or if he is unavailable, at the SERVIZE AZUR near the front Reception Desk. Please get a receipt for reimbursement. Please ensure there is ample gas for the next people who come to rent.

Electric Boiler

This is situated in a cupboard to the left just above the oven inside the mobilehome.

Electricity Failure

If you overload the electricity supply, e.g. running hairdryer, coffee maker, air conditioning, microwave, kettle or vacuum cleaner simultaneously it will cut out. Please make sure you have candles on hand, a flashlight or an app on your mobile phone.

If the electricity fails, go into the toilet and push all the buttons up on the box.

Barbecue

Charcoal barbecues and open fires are strictly forbidden on the campsite and in the area because of the danger of forest fires. However, you can use the gas barbecue provided. Please leave the barbecue clean at the end of your stay.

On departure

We would please ask you to leave everything neat and clean.

Focal points are:

2 x gas hobs and both cookers (gas and electric, inside and out)

2 x fridge/freezers, but please leave them on after defrosting for the next clients

2 x sinks

Shower

Toilet

Outside kitchen cabinets and worktops

Tables and chairs

Please vacuum and wash all floors

Please make sure you remove all leftover food from the cupboards and fridge/freezers

Turn off the boiler

The patio table and chairs can be left outside


Please leave the parasol in the down position

For your own safety and when you depart, please make sure you close all windows and lock the doors when you leave the mobile home unattended.

AMENITIES

There is a covered walkway to the beach (photo). On the right side are toilets, showers and children's activities. There are different activities each day and you can obtain leaflets regarding these from another Reception Desk situated to the left of the walkway near the beach.





At the bottom of the walkway to the right is Crazy Golf, a little train, amusements, clothes shop, supermarket and one restaurant and snack bar. There is another restaurant further along on the left on the beach.

Supermarket: Open daily from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 5 - 7 p.m.

There is also Tiki Spa, which is a pool (a bit like a sauna) where you can obtain food.

To the right of the roundabout is a miniature train, an amusement arcade, trampolines, restaurant, hairdressing salon, supermarket and sometimes market stalls.

The campsite beach and nudist beach are both within walking distance.

There is a second reception and information site near the beach on the left hand side of the walkway.

Supermarket (at the front on the square). Opening times: 8.00 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 5 - 7 p.m.

TIPS & SUGGESTIONS

There are lots of lovely areas to visit. St. Tropez day or night is a thriving fishing village and you can watch the big boats coming into the port around 4 p.m. onwards.

Port Grimaud is very quaint and is dubbed 'Little Venice' because of its canals.

St Tropez

Saint Tropez is located in one of the most beautiful bays in the South of France. It is a picturesque village with beautiful yachts and boats in the harbour, with imposing old facades and streets with shops.

Along the harbour you will find fine artists with their specific paintings. "Place des Lices" with its avenue of trees provides a shady area where you can play jeux de boules and on Tuesdays and Saturdays there is a market in the square. (You may be able to get the bus from the campsite to the market). The bus leaves from the front desk. Please ask about this at Reception,



The citadel of Saint Tropez is also worth a visit.

There is also a large amusement park two large midget golf courses. These are situated in the rotunda of the Geant Casino

The amusement park is open evenings only.

Tickets can be purchased at the entrance to the park. Family tickets (2 adults 2 children) are reasonably priced.

WARNING! Park your car in the parking spaces provided otherwise your car will be towed away.

<u>Port Grimaud</u> is also called the little Venice of France. It has a harbour with canals and is less than 10 km away from the site. You can hire a boat here at a reasonable cost. The entrance to Port Grimaud can be found on the right side at the bridge after leaving the Casino roundabout.



<u>Gorges du Verdon</u> is compared to the "Grand Canyon" of America. It is very impressive whether you drive around it or stop for a break. You can hire canoes to go down the Gorges and there is a small beach. It is well worth a visit.

<u>Gassin</u>

This village is situated in the center of the St Tropez peninsula. It is located on a large hill (201m height) and is just four kilometers away from the sea. The village has crooked streets and old houses which have been preserved throughout the centuries. The location of this village is truly unique. From the village there are spectacular views of the vineyards, forests and the Gulf of St. Tropez. On the coast is Port Gassin, this port is significantly expanding and is increasingly beginning to resemble the ports of Port Grimaud and Cogolin.

Environment Presquile (Peninsula) de St Tropez

For those who want get away from the turbulent life you can drive along the coast to Presqu'ile de St.-Tropez peninsula. These are two villages that have been unchanged for centuries. Atop a 201 meter hill lies Gassin, which was in the past a lookout from which all the Golfe of St Tropez was monitored. That

was at the time of the Moorish invasions. The village is accessible via some narrow, steep, but nicely located roads from the surrounding roads. The houses appear stacked together, as more and more homes were scheduled to be built within the walls. The streets, gates, archways and staircases make Gassin very scenic.

<u>Ramatuelle</u> (2000 inhabitants) is an old Provencal village. The hill on which it is built, is covered with vineyards. The outer row of houses form the walls, in the middle of which is the gate of the Saracens. The story goes that people at one of the pirate raids drove by shooting at them. The church has a beautiful portal dating from 1620, made of a rare, green mottled stone (serpentine, also called green marble).

The peninsula has several viewpoints: from Gassin and Ramatuelle, and the intervening ruins of Moulins, from the rocky headlands of St. Tropez, Camarat and Lardier, the Col de Colle Basse, the Colline de Bestagne (on foot only) and chapel Ste-Anne, both of which are just outside St Tropez. The village of Cogolin (8000 inhabitants) is a lively commercial center with a population of farmers and artisans. Here the art of weaving can be seen, which is of a very high standard. (Tapis and Tissus, a weaving mill can be visited on weekdays). Here, too there are pipes made of heather roots. One collects the straight reeds from the valley and the rods are neatly made. Wind agriculture is focused on wine. It is a traditional Provencal village having the charateristics of Cogolin with its narrow streets and gates. The church there dates back to the 14th century.

Cogolin. This village is situated on the edge of the Massif des Maures and overlooks the Gulf of St. Tropez. This village attracts many visitors throughout the year. In the village you can still visit an old windmill. In addition, you will also find a 14th century bell tower. This town is also connected to the sea. Just four kilometers from the village is the marina of Cogolin. Here, more than 1,500 yachts can moor. The marina is fully equipped. There are many shops, cafes and restaurants where you can quench your thirst.

Cogolin is a suitable starting point for (walking) tours of the Massif des Maures. A car journey of approximately 70 kilometers through the valley of Môle direction Bormes-les-Mimosas, where you can take the beautiful scenic, but narrow road to Collobrières. The road through the Forêt des Maures brings you back into the valley at Grimaud.

Markets in the area

Monday Les Issambres Tuesday Saint Tropez Wednesday Gogolin,

Thursday Port Grimaud / Ramatuelle. There is also a brocante (flea

market) on the right on the road towards Cogolin.

Friday Saint Maxime Saturday Saint Tropez



On Sunday mornings there is a flea market in Grimaud. Follow the road towards the Geant Casino, then go straight over following the Cogolin signs. At the next roundabout turn right towards Grimaud. At the end of this road turn left and follow the signs to Grimaud. At the next junction turn right towards St Maxime. In the woods on the left hand side after about 500 metres is a car park. This is called le Jas de St Robert. Tip: do not go there on a windy day as the fabrics blow about.

Shopping

The Geant Casino supermarket can be found on your left hand side after you leave the Casino roundabout complex on the road to St. Tropez. This supermarket is reasonably priced, does a wonderful fish counter and you can purchase larger bottles of fresh semi-skimmed and full fat milk from here. There is also a shopping mall within the supermarket complex.

You can access the internet from the coffee shop or from the MacDonalds on the other side of the car park. The Geant Casino is open from 9:00 am to 21:00 pm.

There is another supermarket called 'Dia' on the road towards Cogolin. Some things here are considerably cheaper to buy and they do a very good range in fresh meat, fruit and vegetables as well as frozen foods and drink etc. To find it you need to go past the Casino supermarket and head for Cogolin. After you have cleared the Casino roundabout complex you will come to another roundabout. Go straight over towards Cogolin, and a little way further along you will see a parade of shops on your right. There is a hardware store, clothes Maison Le Monde (a beautiful decoration shop), Morgan (a clothing boutique), Weldon (a hardware store), and Gifi (another kind of hardware store selling sunloungers etc. at a cheaper price than Weldon), a boulangerie and the Dia supermarket. There is also a Peugot garage on the road to Cogolin.

If you do not want to drive far for provisions, go out of the campsite and turn left towards Ramatuelle (less than 3 km). After you pass a garage on your left you need to take the next turning on the left signed 'Le Camerat'. Then at the next intersection turn right at the small bridge and the SPAR supermarket is a few yards further on on the right hand side. This is also open on Sunday mornings. You can get a comprehensive range of good meats. fish, fresh milk etc., and opposite SPAR you can buy fresh vegetables.

Tip: If you want to pick up provisions before arriving at Kontiki, exit the motorway at Le Muy and drive through the mountains. At the first roundabout Aqualand Water Park is on your left, and on the right side are a few shops. 300 yards after the 3rd roundabout from the mountains you will see on the right hand side the sign for LIDL supermarket. You can purchase cheap fresh vegetables and meat. You then have about a 20 minute drive from there to the campsite.

Wine Vineyards

There are several Chateau's in the area for those who want to buy kegs and/or bottles of good wine.

Chateau de Pampelonne is our "neighbour" holiday park Toison d'Or.

Chateau de Ramatuelle is located about 4 km from holiday park Kontiki towards Ramatuelle. Continue along the road and round the bend bypassing Ramatuelle. The winery is a few hundred meters along the road on the left.

At the "Geant Casino" roundabout head in the direction of Cogolin, and the winery is immediately left after the roundabout. It is called 'le petit village' and is near the fairground (Luna Park)

Garden centre

At the Geant Casino and amusement park roundabout turn right and take the road for St. Maxime. Some yards along the road after you have passed the Renault garage, you will see the winery on your left hand side.

EXCURSIONS

The campsite arranges several attractive excursions to places of interest in the area, including the Gorges du Verdon, Nice, Monaco, Monte-Carlo, Port Grimaud and the market in Saint Tropez (Tuesday and Saturday) etc.

There are information leaflets available in Reception.
